## Comments from Past Technos TA Interns

As English TAs, our main job is to help students with their homework, test preparation, interview practice, etc. However, our goal is not merely to help them get high scores, but rather to encourage their self-improvement. That involves more than just working with their papers and grades.

While some students are pretty good at English, the level of most students is not the highest I've seen. They're quite shy, and they're from a variety of majors, some of which do not study English at all. There can therefore be a big difference of level among Technos students, so you should be welcoming, conscientious, and patient.

It's recommended to speak English to the students as much as possible so they can practice the language. If you expect to improve your Japanese by speaking it all the time at work, unfortunately that won't happen. You should have plenty of opportunities to speak Japanese with Technos staff, however, and outside of work you can immerse yourself in the language and culture as much as you want.

As for the money, you'll get paid as an intern, so not a lot. But the net income is more than enough to live comfortably in Tokyo. I always save at least half of the salary for loan payment and big travels, and still have enough to go out every weekend.

Leisure activities aside, groceries and transportation are the two main expenses. Cooking by yourself saves a lot of money, and there are a number of supermarkets around the apartment. The apartment is right across the street from Technos and about a 20-minute walk from the nearest train station. You can use a bike provided by Technos, but if you don't want to ride it up the hill on the way to the station you can take the bus.

Our job includes updating Technos' social media and writing blogs, as well as planning and preparing for various events. This job requires you to be outgoing, understanding, good-humored, patient, self-sufficient, and hard-working.

The work schedule is flexible, and you can take classes or join clubs that are of interest to you, as long as you work it out with the Department Chief. You may occasionally be asked to come in on weekends for special events, but you'll get days off in exchange.

Koganei is an awesome place to live as it is full of parks and interesting sights, while also providing easy access to everything the rest of Tokyo has to offer. I personally wish I had had more Japanese experience prior to arriving in Japan as it would have benefitted my personal adventures. But if you are open-minded, positive, and diligent, this internship is rewarding in many ways.
